



## Diocese of St. Augustine Certification Program Level I

The current level I certification for teachers of religion (catechists) was promulgated by Bishop John Snyder in 1998, reaffirmed by Bishop Victor Galeone in 2005 and reaffirmed again with updating by Bishop Felipe Estévez in 2011. It is presumed that each catechist is aware of the catechetical guidelines for the United States published in the *National Directory for Catechesis* (U.S. Catholic Conference of Bishops, 2005). In addition, it is assumed that Catechists are familiar with *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* and have at least a working knowledge of the curriculum guidelines for Religion for their particular teaching level. Also, assumed is a working knowledge of the Diocesan Sacramental Guidelines as well as familiarity with the teacher's manual and the scope and sequence of the approved religion textbook series that they are currently using.

In addition, the following resources are to be mastered by those who serve the Church in catechetical ministry. **These readings are to be done prior to attending the certification sessions.**
